### 2. Course Description

This course is designed for students who have completed Intensive Korean 1. The goal of this class is for students, as active learners, to improve their skills evenly across the four areas of speaking, listening, writing and reading. Through this course students will learn expressions and grammar used in daily life and broaden their understanding of Korean culture and language.

### 3. Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Read and understand short Korean texts and write simple paragraphs more accurately.
- Use more Korean grammar and vocabulary to make longer and more detailed sentences.
- Have conversations in various situations, such as using honorifics or handling tasks at a bank or post office.
- Gain a better understanding of Korean culture and customs through activities and discussions.

### 4. Course Methodology

- 1) Textbook and class: This course builds on the grammar and vocabulary learned in Intensive Korean 1 and introduces more advanced grammar and expressions. Each unit consists of two sub-units, with the goal of completing one unit per week. New vocabulary is introduced in each unit, with additional topic-specific or situational vocabulary

included as needed. Each unit focuses on four key grammar points and follows a structured progression: vocabulary, grammar, speaking practice (including simple speaking and dialogue exercises), and reading activities.

## 2) Exam

- The course will include two quizzes, a midterm exam, and a final exam (covering both reading and speaking). Details about the exams will be provided approximately two weeks in advance. A brief review session will be held before each exam, and information about the format of quizzes and exams will also be shared at that time. The midterm exam will only be a written test, while the final exam will also include a speaking test. The exams will assess grammar and vocabulary covered in class. **Make-up exams will only be considered in exceptional cases**, such as illness or a family funeral, officially recognized by the university.
- The midterm and final exams are scheduled for the 8th and 16th weeks, respectively. However these dates may change depending on UCR circumstances, and any changes will be announced promptly.

3) Assignments: There will be writing assignments, and deadlines must be strictly adhered to. Assignments should be submitted according to the format provided by the instructor. Late submissions may result in a reduction in points.

4) Presentation: The presentation will be on the same topic as the writing assignment. It will be an individual presentation, with detailed instructions provided two weeks before the presentation date. After submitting the writing assignment, students will receive individual feedback. They will then revise their scripts for the presentation based on this feedback.
